

Pursuant to Article 13 of Regulation 2016/679 of the European Parliament and of the Council of the European Union of April 27, 2016 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data and repealing Directive 95/46/EC (hereinafter: "General Regulation" or "GDPR"), we inform you that:

1. The administrator of your personal data is Central Rescue Mine Station S.A with its registered seat in Bytom 41-902 Chorzowska 25 St., entered in the register of entrepreneurs kept by the District Court Katowice-Wschód in Katowice, VIII Economic Department under the KRS number: 0000223325, NIP: 626 000 38 20, share capital of: PLN 16,000,000.00, paid in full, hereinafter referred to as the Company
2. The controller has appointed a data protection officer at the Company, who can be contacted at the email address: iod@csrg.bytom.pl.
3. Your personal data will be processed on the basis of Article 6(1) f GDPR, i.e. based on the necessity of the processing for the purposes of the legitimate interests pursued by the Administrator.
4. The legitimate interest pursued by the Company is to perform on its behalf and for its benefit the activities covered by the power of attorney granted, which is also the purpose of the processing of personal data.
5. Your personal data will not be disclosed to other entities, except as described in generally applicable laws. Only authorized employees of the Administrator and possibly an entity that processes your personal data on behalf of the Administrator on the basis of a contract of entrustment of personal data processing will have access to the data.
6. Your personal data will be stored for a period of 10 years, in connection with the implementation of archiving obligations.
7. Your personal data will be stored for a period of 10 years, in connection with the implementation of archiving obligations.
8. You have the right to lodge a complaint with the Supervisory Authority if you consider that the processing of personal data concerning you violates the GDPR.
9. Provision of data is voluntary, however, it is necessary to perform for the Administrator the activities covered by the power of attorney.
10. Your personal data will not be processed by automated means including profiling.
